CHRISTMAS AROUND THE WORLD

When we think of Christmas food, countries around the world favor their own delicacies from turkey and ham, to roast goose, to tamales, to roast pig. But in Japan, Kentucky Fried Chicken tops the list of holiday favorites! KFC opened there in 1970 and followed with a massive advertising campaign to encourage its chicken dinners as splendid fare for Christmas Eve. Today people stand in line for hours to get KFC meals and even submit orders months in advance.

> In South Africa eating fried caterpillars may seem like one of the weirdest Christmas traditions. But these aren't just run-of-the-mill caterpillars you find in the garden. It's the Pine Tree Emperor Moth, or Christmas caterpillar, which is covered in very festive hues.

"Jingle Bells" is one of today's most popular Christmas songs, but it was originally a Thanksgiving song titled "One Horse Open Sleigh." It was written by James Lord Pierpont and performed at his church's Thanksgiving concert. In 1857, it was republished under its title of today.

Another strange tradition comes from Iceland, where a giant cat is said to roam the snowy countryside at Christmas. Traditionally farmers would use the Yule Cat as an incentive for their workers. Those who worked hard would receive a new set of clothes, but those who didn't, would be devoured by the gigantic cat-like beast. Today it is customary in Iceland for everyone to get new clothing for Christmas. (To avoid an unpleasant death?)
